

GIULIO LUCARINI BETWEEN THE SAHARA AND THE NILE. THE ARCHAEOLOGY OF FARAFRA OASIS

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Farafra is one of the oases of the Egyptian Western Desert, a large region made up of a series of shallow basins and depressions. Recent archaeological investigations showed how during the Mid Holocene Farafra functioned as a crossroads for people and resources in the trajectories between the Western Desert, with a particular emphasis on its northern edge, and the middle Nile Valley.

Dr. Giulio Lucarini is a Marie Curie Fellow at the McDonald Institute for Archaeological Research at the University of Cambridge (UK). His research interest focuses on the transition from foraging to food production economies in North Africa.
